Peter and the Starcatcher is my kind of theater. It's a play that can not be just executed, but re-envisioned line by line, scene by scene. It is inherently theatrical, and would be valueless if told on film or video. It requires creativity from every member of the theatrical team, especially the actors who must create whole environments using the barest of resources; their voices, bodies, and a few haphazardly found or invented props.

Employing direct address and anachronistic topical humor, it requires an engaged audience actively suspending its disbelief. More than a story, it is a happening. As I am grateful to the entire cast and crew for going on this journey with me, to discover the origins of the Pan mythos, I would also like to thank you, our audience for engaging in a kind of theater that requires more of your imagination and generosity.

For us it is a joy to perform, because the theater is very much like starstuff, "It makes you what you want to be."
